

Bio of Dr. C. Ray Gentry President & CEO, SBCAL, McDonough, GA

On May 4, 2015, Ray was elected by the Executive Team of the Southern Baptist Conference of Associational Leaders (SBCAL) to be their next leader. He has served as President & CEO since July 1, 2015. He is also the Editor of the SBCAL book, "The Baptist Association: Assisting Churches, Advancing the Gospel," published by Rainer Publishing in 2020.

Founded in 1960, the SBCAL is the oldest and largest associational network in Southern Baptist life. It stands ready to serve the 1100+ associations in North America, whether they have a full-time, part-time, or volunteer Associational Mission Strategist (AMS). The mission of SBCAL is to equip, encourage, and network associational leaders, providing resources, coaching, fellowship, and professional development.

Ray began his service as an associational leader in 1993. He has had the unique privilege of serving as a Pastor of two churches, an Associate Pastor of three churches, and as an associational leader of five associations. He is the founding associational leader of the Southside Baptist Network, Georgia Baptists' newest association, established March 1, 2013 from the former South Metro and Henry Baptist Associations. Prior to serving the Southside Baptist Network, he was called to revitalize the Henry Baptist Association in McDonough, GA in 2011.

The Lord has blessed the Southside Baptist Network (SBN) with 80+ congregations – including 23 ethnic congregations – in seven counties of metro Atlanta.

Ray was raised in the Air Force town of Warner Robins, GA. His father was a successful farmer. He is a graduate of Middle Georgia College, Cochran, GA (ABA); the University of Georgia, Athens, GA (BBA); Southwestern Baptist Theological Seminary, Fort Worth, TX (MDIV); and Southeastern Baptist Theological Seminary, Wake Forest, NC (DMIN)

He and his wife, Debra, are blessed with daughters April (Rev. Peter Witkowski) and Allison, Director of Communications for SBN and for SBCAL. They also have three adorable grandchildren.
